

Are Your Club Standing Rules in Compliance with the New PI Bylaws?

Have you amended your club's standing rules to be in compliance with the new PI Bylaws? I hope that each club has reviewed their standing rules and made the necessary changes to comply with the new Pilot International bylaws. As a reminder, the following areas should be addressed:

- 1. **Membership** Membership categories need to be deleted if these are listed in your club's standing rules . . . since the only membership category is now "member." We do have 2 honorary categories listed in the bylaws . . . and they are **emeritus** and **honorary**.
- 2. **Club meetings** Standing rules should state the minimum number of meetings your club will hold during the year . . . PI bylaws say you must hold a minimum of 6. You can hold more, so you could continue as you are now.
- 3. **Quorums** Your club needs to spell out in your standing rules what constitutes a quorum for conducting business. Robert's Rules of Order says a quorum is a majority of the members on your club's roster.
- 4. **Nominating Committee** Since PI bylaws require clubs to elect their Nominating Committee no later than 2 months prior to district convention, then our clubs need to elect Nominating Committees at the February business meeting. This needs to be spelled out in your club's standing rules.
- 5. **Club Officers** Your club's standing rules should spell out the officers needed to operate your club and the length of time they will serve in office. The PI bylaws tell us that clubs need to have a minimum of a President, President Elect, Secretary and Treasurer . . . but clubs have options.
- 6. **Election of Officers** According to the new PI Bylaws, officers must be elected "no later than 1 month prior to district convention." This means that clubs need to elect new officers at their March meeting . . . again this needs to be spelled out in your club's standing rules.

Your club could also choose to include **Termination of Membership** in your standing rules as well, but it is **not required**. This area is not addressed in the PI Bylaws . . . it is strictly a local club's decision.

For specific language to use in your club's standing rules to address the above issues, refer to the PI website under members/governance PI bylaws for an article entitled <u>Club Standing Rules Update</u> Guidelines.
